How does Lord and Lady Westing's Will work?

Lord and Lady Westing's Will is intended for 11 to 16 guests – plus the Host (game co-ordinator). The step-by-step guide explains which characters to omit if you have fewer than 16 guests (you do need at least 11, however). Here's how this works:

Lord and Lady Westing's Will is played over the course of three to four hours and is particularly suited to a buffet meal. One person plays the role of Butler or Housekeeper (the Host/game co-ordinator). They are responsible for making sure everything runs smoothly and that all guests have the information they need. The Butler/Housekeeper does not count toward the minimum or maximum number of players.

The guests are all present at Chateauhouse to celebrate the lives and legacies of Lord Edward and Lady Judith Westing. They have their own goals and agendas, and how they choose to achieve these goals is up to them. *Lord and Lady Westing's Will* is an evening of mistrust, revenge, lies, and murder!


ECCENTRIC COUPLE'S LEGACY CONTINUES
